2025 was a year of growth and connection as we saw God call His people to care for families in need. Here are some highlights from the year...

CHURCH LAUNCHES

This year, New Mercies welcomed four new partner churches: Grabill Missionary Church in Grabill, Hope Rising in Huntington, Merriam Christian Chapel in Albion, and Shore Church in Shipshewana. We are so thankful for these congregations joining our mission to care for vulnerable families.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Throughout 2025, our team and volunteers actively participated in community events, resource fairs, and symposiums across Northern Indiana. These opportunities helped us connect with new families, agencies, and organizations, building bridges so that we can respond quickly when needs arise.

FAMILY FUN NIGHT

In July, we hosted Family Fun Night, a block-party-style event for families served and volunteers to reconnect! We were delighted to celebrate families who have journeyed toward stability, and to honor volunteers who came alongside those families.

CALLED TOGETHER VOLUNTEER GATHERING

Our fall volunteer gathering, Called Together, was an evening of worship, fellowship, and an inspiring message from Geoff King with Love Fort Wayne, who encouraged us to keep stepping into hard spaces. We also took time to honor the volunteers who make this ministry possible.

Empower Restoration in 2025

As we continue deepening our support for vulnerable families, we are excited to share the ongoing progress of the Empower Restoration Capital Campaign. This new ministry builds on the foundation of our Hosting Ministry by addressing one of the greatest barriers to family reunification: the need for safe, affordable housing.

Mothers and children will have the opportunity to live together in a supportive, Christ-centered environment designed to foster stability, growth, and long-term restoration. Located in the Wells Street Corridor of downtown Fort Wayne, the 12,238-square-foot facility will accommodate up to 17 families and provide access to coaching, community, and local resources.

In 2025, we hosted five Lunch & Learn events that gave ministry partners and community members an inside look at this vision. Attendees toured the future site, heard from Executive Director Bonnie Doolittle about the next steps in renovation and programming, and learned how they could play a role in bringing this project to life.

Thanks to your generosity, we are now 23% funded toward our \$2.8 million renovation goal. We continue to trust God's timing and provision as we move closer to opening the doors and empowering families toward lasting restoration.

Star and Amara's Story

We could give so many examples of families our volunteers have supported this year. We will leave you with just one story...

When Carly and her family first welcomed a sweet baby we will call Amara into their home, she was just shy of her first birthday, not yet walking or talking. Eight months later, she runs through their living room giggling and singing, part of the family's rhythm.

What began as a one-week hosting has become a lasting relationship with Amara and her mom, who we will call Star. "We just love her so much," Carly shares. "We enjoy her company, and it seems like she enjoys ours." Amara's comfort in their home is clear. When the Bickels recently picked her up from daycare, she ran straight into Carly's arms.

As a single mom navigating a challenging season, Star reached out to New Mercies Ministries for support. Through the Hosting Program, the Bickels provided a safe, loving space for Amara while Star worked toward her goals. The hosting started out as temporary care, but it has grown into a meaningful, ongoing connection between two families. "It's been amazing to watch our boys care for her," Carly says. "The way this has taught them to love others is so neat." The boys affectionately call her "baby Amara," and she calls them "da boys."

Over time, Carly and Star have built a genuine friendship. They share updates, exchange photos, and support one another like extended family. Star calls the Bickels her "fam."

This story captures what happens when believers say yes to coming alongside another family. For the Bickels, hosting has not just been about helping someone else. It is about becoming a new community for someone who was on their own before.

"We have our parents and siblings," Carly says, "but we love that we can be her village." That's what New Mercies is all about: families walking alongside families, so no one has to face life alone.
